June 10, 2009

Item 1 – Roll Call and Introductions

The meeting was called to order on June 10, 2009 at 9:02 a.m. in the State Office Building Auditorium, First Floor, 1515 Clay Street, Oakland.

Board members present: John Muller, Chair; Terry Young, Vice-Chair; Shalom Eliahu; James McGrath; Steven Moore; William Peacock; Rameshwar Singh.

Board members absent: None.

Tam M. Doduc, Member, State Water Resources Control Board, and liaison to Region 2, addressed the Board.

Item 2 – Public Forum

Mike Connor, General Manager, East Bay Dischargers Authority, recommended the regulatory program for wastewater treatment agencies be reevaluated and greater focus be placed on significant current pollutants, such as pollutants in consumer products.

Laura Reinhard, Policy Associate, Save The Bay, said plastic bags pollute Bay waters. She said a video prepared by Save The Bay that illustrates environmental problems caused by plastic bags may be viewed at [www.savesfbay.org/bayvsbag](http://www.savesfbay.org/bayvsbag). She said Save The Bay is working to increase public awareness about the need to end consumer dependence on single use items like plastic bags. She showed PowerPoint slides and discussed Save The Bay's participation in a recent trash cleanup conducted in the South Bay.

Item 3 – Minutes of the February 11, 2009 Board Meeting

Motion: It was moved by Mr. Peacock, seconded by Mr. Moore, and it was voted unanimously to adopt the Minutes of the February 11, 2009 Board Meeting.

Item 6 – Miller Dismantler, Oakland, Alameda County – Hearing to Consider Administrative Civil Liability for Late Submittal of Annual Monitoring Report Required Under the Statewide NPDES General Permit for Discharges of Storm Water Associated with Industrial Activity

Mr. Wolfe said staff took back the complaint and no action was required.

Item 7 – Enforcement – Information Item on Standard Hearing Procedures for Administrative Civil Liability Cases
